### FROM APEF

#### **NEW COUNTRY MANAGERS**

We are very happy to announce that two new country managers have joined Archives Portal Europe this month:

DENMARK - Kristin Brøgger Jensen from the Rigsarkivet, the Danish National Archives, is the new Country Manager for Denmark, taking the place of August Eriksen. Kristin holds an MA in history and has conducted her career at the Danish National Archives, first in the Business Archives (2004-2015), and currently as coordinator of the Arkivalieronline, the online archives. She also works on web editing, crowdsourcing, and communication for archival institutions.



THE NETHERLANDS - Hans Laagland is the new Country Manager for The Netherlands, taking over from Wim Van Dongen. Hans is an information architect at Tresoar, a cultural heritage institute in Friesland, the northern part of the Netherlands. Tresoar acts as a library, public record office of the province of Fryslân, literary museum, and documentation centre - it is the repository of the history of Friesland. In collaboration with the Dutch National Archives and the Regional History Centers, Hans is the president of the Architecture Commission of the National Archives and the Regional History Centers. His focus is sustainable accessibility to digital cultural heritage,



and he works on topics like e-depot, archiving by design, and new ways to access digital cultural heritage, particularly through linked data. He is a member of <u>RedBot</u> - <u>ECHOES</u>, a combination of two projects that aims to present cultural heritage in new, innovative ways.

### **EAG / EBNA MEETING IN VIENNA**

The Austrian State Archives hosted the 25th meeting of the European Archives Group (EAG) & 38th conference of the European Board of National Archivists (EBNA) in one joint event. The conference serves as a platform for agreeing upon European standards, rules and means of cooperation in the area of cultural heritage and for facing the challenges of digitalisation together. APEF President, Arjan Agema, intervened with a presentation on the history of Archives Portal Europe.


### **ICARUS 10<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY PARTY**

#### **WORKSHOP AT THE HISTORICAL ARCHIVES OF BELGRADE**

On the 17<sup>th</sup> of October the <u>Historical Archives of Belgrade</u> organised a workshop on using Archives Portal Europe for historical and archival research. Students and researchers from Belgrade were introduced to the research tools available on APEF, such as multilingual search and comparative search. The theme of the workshop was **the history of Belgrade** – attendees collected documents from all over Europe that contributed to the history of the city, and searched the Portal to find the information necessary to answer to the quiz questions elaborated by the conference organisers, **Slobodan Mandic** (Assistant Director of the Historical Archives of Belgrade and APEF Country Manager for Serbia) and **Marko Peric** (Historical Archives of Belgrade)

# ARCHIVES PORTAL EUROPE TRANSCRIBATHON London (UK), 30 November 2018

Archives Portal Europe and Transkribus are organising a one-day workshop to teach how to do online archival research with Archives Portal Europe, and how to use Transkribus for automated text transcription. Teams will translate documents from the 13th century onward,



and they will do research on the relations between Europe and Africa, with the purpose of creating a new Research Topic for the Portal.

# CFP - INTERNATIONAL TECHNICAL ARCHIVE COURSE Paris (France), 25 March - 26 April 2019



The International Technical Archive Course (Stage Technique International d'Archives, STIA), created in 1951, is held every year in Paris for a period of 5 weeks. It is organised by the Ministry of Culture and Communication (Directorate General of Heritage).

It is a general course in French which aims to train French and foreign archivists, exchange experiences between professionals from different countries, and expand a network of people who attended, facilitated, or organised the internship. Accompanied by French-speaking experts, trainees share their experiences in all areas of the archivist's profession. Back in their country, they are called to make the knowledge gained in Paris grow with their own professional networks. **Applications are accepted until the 15**th **December – more information (in French) here**




### IN THE LOOP
